<u>Suggestions for Program</u>: This program will address the recent Supreme Court decision in *Bisbing v. Bisbing*, 2017 WL 3392717, and its impact on relocation cases in New Jersey. The presentation should include a comparison of the new standard set forth in *Bisbing* to the previous standard as set forth in *Baures v. Lewis*, 167 N.J. 91 (2001). The presentation should discuss whether there is still some requirement of good faith in seeking permission to relocate outside of New Jersey (i.e. when is an intended relocation not sufficient to constitute a change of circumstances warranting a review of custody based on the "best interests" analysis).

<u>Suggestions for Handouts</u>: Copies of *Bisbing v. Bisbing* and *Baures v. Lewis*. A recitation and brief summary of the holdings in the cases leading up to *Baures* and *Bisbing*. Any recent articles analyzing and/or discussing *Bisbing*.
