This year, over 160 first year law students will compete in the First Year Competition. To help make this experience a success, the Moot Court Board respectfully requests your assistance.

Your knowledge and insight, as it relates to complex legal problems, offers our students constructive guidance on speaking and interacting with judges and other professionals in the legal field.

With this in mind, the Moot Court Board here at George Mason's Antonin Scalia Law School invites you to judge the upcoming 2020 First Year Moot Court Competition, which will be held on **Saturday, March 28, 2020 & Sunday, March 29, 2020**. The schedule is as follows:

On Saturday, March 28, 2020,

- the morning rounds will run from approximately 8:30 AM to 11:30 AM, and
- the afternoon rounds will run from approximately 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM.

On Sunday, March 29, 2020,

- the morning rounds will run from approximately 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM, and
- the afternoon rounds will run from approximately 2:00 PM to 4:30 PM.

You are welcome to judge any of the four time slots on either day, or any combination of the available time slots.

Because we know that your time is valuable and your commitment to judge makes a tremendous difference to the success and quality of the competition, the Moot Court Board will send you a judge's packet no later than March 18, 2020 to help you prepare. This packet will contain a copy of the problem, a bench brief containing key background cases, an outline of potential arguments for both parties, and information on parking at the law school.
