September 8, 2022 Mixing Modes to Resolve Disputes and the Problem of Neutrals "Switching Hats"

Mediators and arbitrators have historically been trained to carefully "stay in their lanes," but parties with disputes Toften do not make or even understand the distinction between the various modes of ADR. Rather, parties often  $\frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}$  $\bigstar$  simply seek someone to assist them in resolving their dispute. The need to meet the parties' needs has led to a  $\bigstar$ ☆robust discussion among neutrals regarding "mixing modes" to promote efficient and effective dispute resolution.  $\star$  This program will provide an introduction to this ongoing conversation, with a panel including Inn Member  $\star$  $\stackrel{\text{tr}}{\sim}$  Steven Bierman, Debbie Masucci, and Edna Sussman addressing the process of working with parties to design  $\stackrel{\text{tr}}{\sim}$  $\stackrel{\bigstar}{\rightarrow}$  an explicitly "mixed" dispute resolution process and specific ways in which adjudicative methods, specifically  $\frac{1}{2}$  arbitration, can provide more opportunities for parties to pursue settlement in the midst of the arbitration. The  $\frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}$  panel will also explore the ethical issues embedded in neutrals "switching hats" (changing roles) in dispute  $\frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}$  $\star$  resolution processes. ☆

☆ We will also be bestowing the Jeydel Award, which is given annually in memory of Richard K.
