Jonathan M. Hyman is Professor of Law Emeritus and Alfred C. Clapp Public Service Scholar Emeritus at Rutgers Law School in Newark, New Jersey, where he served as Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, Administrative Director of the Constitutional Litigation Clinic, and Co-director of the Rutgers Program in Conflict Management. His courses and clinics at Rutgers included Constitutional Litigation, Alternative Dispute Resolution, Mediation, Contracts, Federal Jurisdiction, and Criminal Law. He was a member of the New Jersey Supreme Court Complementary Dispute Resolution Committee and the Editorial Board of the Clinical Law Review. He has mediated cases in court and at the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and arbitrated commercial disputes for the American Arbitration Association. In 2007 he received the James Boskey ADR Practitioner of the Year award from the Dispute Resolution Section of the New Jersey State Bar Association and was named a Legend of ADR in New Jersey. He currently trains mediators for the New Jersey Association of Professional Mediators, and has taught settlement negotiation to judges at the National Judicial College.
