Meetings and Membership

Our Members learn side-by-side with some of the most experienced judges and attorneys throughout our communities.

The meetings begin at 5:30 pm and include networking opportunities, a one-hour CLE presented by Inn members, and a meal. Attendance at both the CLE and the meal is required. Membership to the Bryan AIC is limited to no more than 80 active members. Because of this, we must adhere to a strict attendance policy where new members must attend at least 5 out of 6 of these meetings to remain in good standing.
